Betty chronicled these events in her book, Raising Daisy Rothschild. Visit the Daphne Sheldrick Elephant Orphanage where you will be able to adopt a baby elephan and become a foster parent! This is a nursery and rehab center for infant elephants that have lost their families, as well as the occasional rhino, zebra and other wildlife. Daphne was the first person to successfully raise an orphan infant elephant, discovering a formula that has now been

used widely. The widow of the famous naturalist and warden of Tsavo from 1948 to 1976, David Sheldrick, and Daphne has dedicated her life to conservation. These infants are eventually released into the wild at Tsavo East National Park and end up in the care of other orphans who have been successfully reintroduced to the wild. Lunch will be on own at Utamanduni Craft Centre as you shop for souvenirs. Visit Karen Blixen Museum famous for the award-winning movie "Out of Africa". Visit to Kobe beads factory where you can buy some bead work and other souvenirs as you see how they are made. You will be transferred to your hotel for freshening before going for dinner at a local city restaurant.
